

# From The President: Brian Slatter

Well, for most of us the most exciting time of the year is nearly here. Still after well over 20 years of hunting the Red and Fallow deer ruts, the build up to this time of year is still as enjoyed as much as ever. To all our new members all I can say is if you haven't chased roaring Red stags or grunting Fallow bucks you need to make a plan to do it, once you do I'm sure you will be back to do it again.

My days of seriously hunting Queensland trophy reds and fallow are pretty much over, I will still take a couple of culls of each species but it's more about helping mates and leaving good heads to those who really want them. The areas I hunt now rarely produce great trophies, but that should never decide whether to hunt there or not, an over 30 inch 6x6 from this area is as hard earned a trophy as you will find anywhere.

We have organised 3 weekends down near Ballandean for our mentored Fallow hunts. We can only take 3 hunters per weekend, so this is for those with virtually no experience at all. If you fit this requirement, talk to one of our executives at the next meeting. All participants will need to attend at least one of John Bennets shoots on every 4th weekend.

The branch and the State are running hunts at Nundle at the end of April, if it is open.

It is only a couple of months till our AGM, we really need some new faces on our committee and executive, don't be scared, it isn't that hard a job.

# AJ Productions—Deluxe Universal Game Caller

Review by Adam Simons



# **Main Hand Unit Features:**

- Larger Speaker: 75mm
- 15 volume control levels
- Volume Output: **120+ decibels** (no need to use any accessory Amplifier)
- Two x Interchangeable sound cards slots = 10 recordings
- Operates on 4 x AA batteries for extra longevity (not supplied)
- Alternative DC 6-12V DC power socket
- New STOP button design: features STOP/PAUSE.

The productions game caller is a universal caller that takes memory cards you insert into the back of the caller, the caller has 2 card slots with each card having 5 different calls. The caller requires 4 AA batteries that last a good amount of time, there is the option to hook up a remote to the caller so you can have the speaker a few meters away from you. (this can be purchased later)

There are a total of 24 different sound cards that range from Red Deer calls to upland birds. There are two different Red Deer cards, one recorded from a young stag and the other from an old stag, there is also a hind call included in one of the cards.

The overall build quality is fairly good however upon receiving mine, one of the buttons on didn't work. After contacting them about the issue,

I was quickly sent out a new button pad to replace the faulty one.

The caller retails for \$160 nzd and the cards are \$40 nzd. For the price, variety of cards and battery life, I think if you're in the market for a caller you'd be hard pressed to find something of better value for the same quality.






# February Guest Speaker


- Once all tickets have been sold, the raffle will be drawn at the next Brisbane Branch meeting.

### ADA Shelley Hunting Camp (2 April to 8 April inclusive, 7 nights)

The Northern & Yorke Branch of South Australia is once again hosting the Shelley Hunting Camp in NE Victoria. Headquarters for this 2-8 April event is the Shelley Forest Camp, located midway between Tallangatta and Corryong on the Murray Valley Highway. The dates of the camp correspond to the early part of the fallow deer rut and the red deer roar.

NE Victoria is mountainous and a mosaic of native forest, open dairy country and pine plantations. The area has abundant fallow and sambar deer, and a smaller population of red deer.

The Shelley Hunting Camp will run for seven (7) consecutive nights between (Thursday) 2 April and (Wednesday) 8 April inclusive. ADA members from any branch are welcome to stay for all 7 nights, or as little as 1 night. There are no outdoor powered sites; however, persons camping outside will have full and equal access to all indoor amenities.

The cost is \$35 per person, per night for clean, dormitory style accommodation, and \$30 per person per night for camping outside (swag, tent or self-provided caravan). Prices include great fellowship, an excellent kitchen, mess and lounge facility and 24/7 hot showers.

Unlike in previous years, attendees will NOT be required to pay a one-off surcharge.

For insurance reasons, the Shelley Hunting Camp is only open to financial ADA members.

Prior to registering for the camp, please read the Essentials Info-Pack (below).

ADA hunters who register early and according to the above details will be prioritised when hunting areas are selected on the first night of the camp.

Please, only telephone the organiser after thoroughly reading the Essentials Info-Pack (below). Bookings will ideally be made without a phone call.


# Shelley Hunting Camp: Essentials Info-Pack

We ask that all ADA members bring their ADA membership cards so that we can check their credentials for insurance purposes. All hunters need a current firearms licence (from any state) and a Victorian Game License (<a href="http://www.gma.vic.gov.au/licensing/apply-for-a-game-licence">http://www.gma.vic.gov.au/licensing/apply-for-a-game-licence</a>).

- The minimum legal calibre for hunting sambar and red deer in Victoria is 270 Win. For transport in Victoria, firearms and ammunition should be secured in separate locked compartments (e.g. portable hard-case/ammo tin) both <u>attached</u> to the inside of the transporting vehicle; note that the transport of spotlights with firearms in deer habitat (i.e. NE Victoria) is prohibited by law.
- 2. Shelley is at 800 metres altitude and therefore cold at night. A -5 degree sleeping bag is advisable. No linen will be supplied for indoor accommodation.
- 3. During the camp, all ammunition and firearms are banned from the buildings. Ammunition and firearms must remain locked-away and out of sight in vehicles.
- 4. Attendees are responsible for obtaining their own map(s), navigation equipment and other gear for the bush; however, there will be a <u>very limited</u> supply of maps available free, or for purchase. Note that "print-ready" and new 2019 "web-based" maps are downloadable from

- the Victorian Game Management Authority (GMA) website. GMA maps are essential to delineate legal hunting areas in this complex terrane.
- 5. On the first evening of the camp, people will choose the area they wish to hunt and inform the camp organiser(s) of their intentions, by outlining/marking individual hunting areas on a large-scale wall-poster map, and by recording details in a log-book. The area is vast, therefore nobody will miss-out on a good hunting opportunities. However, in the case where someone's preferred area is taken by another hunter, we ask that everyone respects that fact.
  - The immediate area around Shelley has NOT been affected by the January 2020 bushfires, although some areas beyond 6 km from the camp have been burnt. This should not overly impact the choice of hunting areas.
- 6. Telstra mobile phones are essential for NE Victoria and the High Country no other network services these areas. Having said that, phones will have limited use in most hunting situations. We insist that hunters have a 2-way radio, GPS, laminated maps and a compass. An emergency bivy-bag and realistic survival gear must be carried in a rucksack no smaller than 25–30 litres.
- 7. Hunters can operate alone in the bush; however, upon arrival at camp they will team-up with a "hunting buddy". "Hunting buddies" will not necessarily hunt together, although some might. A "hunting buddy" must understand the day-to-day intentions of his mate (e.g. where his car will be parked, which direction he is stalking). The rationale is that if something goes wrong, the alarm can be raised quickly, in the first instance by the buddy. Blaze orange needs to be worn by hunters operating in areas where other hunters are likely to be encountered.
- 8. All people attending the camp must have had some hunting experience. However, even people with no experience of eastern Victoria are encouraged to attend. Such people will find their feet quickly as long as they arrive prepared and with the correct equipment.
  - Most of the dorm rooms have two beds; several have 3 or 4 beds as bunks. We will do our best to place people in the groups they want that has proved easy in past camps. However, if you definitely want to sleep indoors, please bring an air mattress/swag for the very large "family rooms" in the unlikely event that the dorm rooms are full.
  - The trick is to be flexible, and bring a tent/swag/ air-mattress in case the dorm rooms are full: that way you will not miss-out.
- 11. Payment for accommodation at Shelley must be made in CASH ONLY on the evening of Thursday (2 April) or the day of arrival – NO EXCEPTIONS. The closest flexi-tellers are 42 km away at Corryong or Tallangatta, therefore everyone is advised to bring the exact change upon arrival.
- 12. There are no shops at Shelley. The closest modern supermarkets are at Wodonga, 82 km to the west; Wodonga Woolworths is open between 6 AM and midnight, seven days.

The policy has an excess of \$50 each and every claim and protects members anywhere in Australia, 365 days of the year, plus overseas for 21 days in any one year.
