President's Report

Welcome to 2020 fellow hunters.

And what a start to the New Year it has been. Large tracts of the sambar range have been destroyed by the fires across East Gippsland, and no doubt many deer have perished. Our thoughts are with those who have lost their homes and livelihoods in these fires. I watched from the vantage point of Eagle Point Bluff when the fire to the north of Bairnsdale took off that afternoon. I couldn't help feeling that many of my friends' homes were being damaged or destroyed. I sure it was terrifying for everyone in the path of these fires. The recovery process will in some cases could take years. I know that many members have been actively involved in helping out in the aftermath. Removing burnt fences and clearing away the debris. I take my hat off to everyone involved in volunteering to do this hot and dirty job.

You can call it climate change or whatever you like. What I say is that the seasons have become warmer and dryer in my lifetime. I'm a hunter, fisherman and an outdoors person, I have noticed these changes over my lifetime. Debating the cause is not going to change it. We are going to have to adapt.

It will rain again and hopefully soon, the landscape will recover.

In the light of the previous four or five major fires in our region in the last twenty years. We know the deer will take advantage of the recovering bush, and do very well in the years to come. We are going to have to play our part in managing their numbers in the areas where they become over abundant.

Government departments have shown in the past that they lack the knowledge, skills and resources to control deer numbers in the areas where they have become a problem.

I call on government to manage the hunting resource (us). We number in excess of forty thousand strong and growing. We are self-funded, equipped and motivated to help manage the inevitable boom in deer numbers in the years to come. It's time for governments and bureaucrats to cast off their prejudices and biases think outside the box. And work with us to manage wild deer.

Wairewa Deer Control Program

This program is understandably on hold for the foreseeable future.

Much of the Wairewa valley has been decimated by the recent bush fires. Some of the residence that we had been working with to control the deer have been very badly affected. In some cases they have lost everything. A few of our members have been back up there to do what they can to help out. It is fair to say that controlling deer is probably the last thing on the farmer's minds at the moment.

The recent rain events have caused the pasture to jump out of the ground. It's a bit surreal to drive through the valley and see burnt building and fences in a sea of green. There is every chance that the surviving wild life will be taking advantage of this situation. The surrounding bush remains in a devastated state, trees blackened to the crown, ash covers the forest floor.

Blonde Bay Ballot

The first periods of the Blonde Bay, Boole Poole and Snake Island ballot hunts are about to commence. For the first two of these locations are still suffering the effects of three years of drought. Conditions will be very challenging for hunters in those locations. Deer numbers appear low and water is scarce.

On the other hand South Gippsland has had a good season so prospects for hunters on Snake Island should be good if they get the weather.

Two of our local stalwarts, Doug Harvey and Doc Carpenter are drawn to hunt on Snake. There should be no excuse for Doc. This is the second year in a row that Doc has drawn Snake so he should be able to use last years' experience in a Monster Stag.

Good luck to both hunters.
